A Different View All Key Stages

Learn how artists use sketches and drawings to develop ideas. Explore the building, draw different viewpoints and angles, and experiment with a range of materials.

Curriculum Links: Art, History

Changing Places KS2

Requires three months notice

Discover how your local area has changed using a bespoke pack, developed by Historic England, consisting of archive maps and aerial photographs from the past to the present day.

Curriculum Links: Geography, History

Creatures in Clay KS1-3

Suitable for churches with stone carving

Hunt for hidden creatures and grotesques to inspire your own creation, experimenting with air-dry clay to produce a sculpture.

Discover the Past KS1-3

Discover, explore, and gather evidence from your local historic church. How was it built, how has it changed and what can we learn about the people who have been part of its story?

Curriculum Links: History, RE, Geography, English

Features of Faith: Christianity KS1-3

Explore the typical characteristics of a church and learn their significance for Christians. Find out about features including the altar, font, and stained glass.

Map Your Visit KS1-3

Navigate your local church, identify key features and plot them on your own floorplan. Identify cardinal points and find out why they are important to church buildings. Cartography in action!

Poetry from the Pulpit KS1-3

Compose poetry inspired by your local church building, its decoration and atmosphere. Be inspired by a multi-sensory exploration of the church, use your imagination and get creative!

Put STEM into practice. Take measurements and calculate area, read and compare temperature in and outside, and consider how these readings help with building conservation.

Examine stained glass windows in your local church. Why are they there, what stories and hidden symbols do they hold? Create a stained glass window using your stories and memories.
