Queen Street Masonic Temple - Open Day

Phoenix Hall, Queen Street, Sunderland, was built as a Masonic Temple in 1785 and retains nearly all of its original features, the Temple Furniture dates from 1729 originating from a lodge in Gateshead. The hall is a Grade I listed building built in the Palladian style of Architecture and has just been restored thanks to a grant from Historic England. Members will be on hand to both guide and explain the history attached to the building.

An exhibition exploring the identity of Washington through the perspective of Washington Miners. Using visual tintype portraiture by Andy Martin and biographies and collective pieces created by Dr Louise Powell, the Coal Face exhibition captures the last generation of Washington Miners' memories and sense of belonging in a changing coalfield community. Recalling the era when the pits were still open and operational, examining the layering of place in an area where half a dozen pit villages had the superstructure of a new town imposed on top. The Oaks: The History of a Street and Some of its **Residents**


A talk about the history of The Oaks, Sunderland. The street, of grand Victorian and Edwardian houses, was built between 1866 and 1905 for well-to-do businessmen and professional people. Its residents have included two knights of the realm, and an MP, as well as a number of Mayors and Councillors. But it has not been without a darker side. One resident went bankrupt in a spectacular fashion in the 1880s and did not seem to know where his money had gone; another was charged with manslaughter in the early 20th century, and two residents committed suicide.
